We are pleased to welcome Hoi Thanh Tin Lanh church, translated to the Good News Church (pronounced *Hoy TAN Tin Lan*) to use our facilities on Sunday afternoons.

In the early 1980s Hamilton became the home to hundreds of refugees from Vietnam. Saigon had fallen to Ho Chi Minh and people fled by the thousands rather than live under the new Communist regime. Among that group were many Christians. Upon their arrival in Hamilton they were invited to worship along with John and Judy Smith and their then three small children at the old location of St. George's on Tom at Strathcona Streets.

The Anglican service and The Book of Common Prayer were difficult for people who had not yet learned to speak English. For a while they met at the Smith's home for a simplified service but soon decided to form a Vietnamese congregation under the aegis of the Christian Missionary Alliance church. It was Alliance missionaries who were in Vietnam for many years who had introduced them to the Gospel message. They soon found a church they could rent and before long had a growing and vital work in Hamilton which continues on the mountain until this day.

Now, years later several of them have come to share our facility on Sunday afternoons as they hope to grow a church in West Hamilton. It is our pleasure to help them to do so. Please make sure you say hello. They might invite you to share their Spring Rolls someday. And you don't want to miss homemade Spring Rolls!

## HONING IN ON HYMNS.....

#### THIS IS MY FATHER'S WORLD

MALTIE DAVENPORT BABCOCK (1858-1901).

Maltbie, a Presbyterian minister living in Syracuse, NY wrote the poem on his many journeys along the Niagara Escarpment looking over Lake Ontario. Maltbie was returning from a trip to the Holy Land when he contracted a bacterial infection, passing away in Naples, Italy in 1901. Following his death, his wife Katharine included 'This is My Father's World" in 'Thoughts for Everyday Living from the Spoken and Written Word of Maltbie Davenport Babcock (1901) .... A shortened version of the poem was put to music in 1915 and as a hymn is enjoyed by many around the world.

All nature sings, and round me rings
The music of the spheres.
