#### WHY GO TO CHURCH ON SUNDAY/

'If you're spiritually alive, you're going to love this! If you're spiritually dead, you won't want to read it. If you're spiritually curious, there is still hope!

A churchgoer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday. He wrote: "I've gone for 30 years now, and in that time I have heard something like 3,000 sermons, but for the life of me, I can't remember a single one of them. So, I think I'm wasting my time, the preachers and priests are wasting theirs b giving sermons at all". This started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor' column., Much to the delight of the editor, it went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher":

"I've been married for almost 30 years now. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals But for the life of me I cannot recall the entire menu for a single one of those meals. But I do know this: They all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise, if I

had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead".

### HONING IN ON HYMNS

No hymn writer has offered as much to Christian hymnology as has Fanny Crosby. She is said to have written in the vicinity of some 8-9,000 hymns in her lifetime. This she did in spite of her blindness from infancy.

She also wrote under various pseudonyms including Mrs. Vanalstyne, her married name.

Pre-pandemic my brother-in-law discovered that he was related to Fanny Crosby. He and my sister invited me to go on a car trip with them to Bridgeport, Connecticut to find her grave.

It was moving indeed to see two stones that marked her place. The smaller stone says "Aunt Fanny- She hath done what she could." The upright tablet has her beginning and ending dates (1820-1915) with the words of her most famous hymn of all "Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine..."

Most interesting was the fact that the famous circus man, PT Barnum, (who helped publish some of Fanny's hymns with financial aid) has the grave across from Fanny's. His is a larger affair, just as one might expect, with his name writ large on a tall imposing plinth. And just across from that is a statue of the man he made famous in the person of Tom Thumb who is taller in death than he ever was in life ( three feet tall ) where he stands in perpetuity in granite. A strange trifecta I thought, with the humblest grave reserved for the woman who gave the world the most.

A few years ago our friend Don Bradbury, who played the piano at Evensong for us each month, commented one day that he was amazed at how Fanny Crosby, without sight, could visualize the things she wrote about. He quoted her words "He hideth my soul in the cleft of the rock".

Don asked "How would Fanny have known what a cleft looked like, or a rock?" I'll remember Don and his salient question always.

Fanny said that never did she resent the Doctor whose actions possibly caused her blindness . "I have always believed that the good Lord has consecrated my work."

So much to learn from Fanny.

When I asked Judy what her favourite Fanny Crosby hymn is she said He Hideth My Soul, I had to admit I was not familiar with that one .. I listened to the words, so wonderful, powerful and soothing. . ALISON

YOU MIGHT ASK? Where in the Bible does it say he hideth my soul in the cleft of the rock?


