Update from the Refugee Sponsorship Committee.

We will try to bring you up to date as things move along, but at the time we are not in a position to give you any information, suffice it to say, that our friend is still in Afghanistan. The risk involved in travelling out of the country, and the exorbitant cost of leaving are a deterrent. He will then be required to support himself in the country where he awaits sponsorship. This is a journey of a lifetime for him.

We are thrilled with the success of our funds which are now at approximately 30% of the necessary amount, and we are optimistic that by the time the money is needed our fund will be in a good position. Tom Power, who is the chair of our committee can give you verbal updates upon request. Some questions posed may be cleared up by the following information: The amount we raise will be used to provide a monthly support payment for one year (which is based on the same calculation that Government sponsors are given). This covers rent, clothing, food and transportation primarily. We will be responsible for providing this monthly once the refugee arrives here; health care and other services are provided by the Government. We do know that refugees are required to pay their own way from the country where they have refugee status to Canada; however the Government has provided a tax free loan to the amount of the fare, with payback starting a year after arrival in Canada. The committee has produced a letter to be completed and signed by donors which gives them options for the dispersal of their donation if the sponsorship quest does not materialize. All donors will be issued a tax receipt for their donation, (other than amounts used to purchase something.) Ask Alison Buffett or Tom Power if you require such a letter with your donation. There are a number of fundraising opportunities coming up, including the Christmas Market on December 2nd.

Please feel free to ask questions of the committee members, and Tom Power in particular. Phone him at 289-489-8697. It

HONING IN ON HYMNS

I NEED THE EVERY HOUR Annie S Hawks 1835-1918

I need Thee ev'ry hour, most gracious Lord No tender voice like Thine, Can peace afford

I need Thee, O I need Thee, Ev'ry hour I need Thee, O bless me now, my Saviour, I come to Thee

I need Thee ev'ry hour , Stay Thou near by; Temptations lose their pow'r When Thou art nigh

I need Thee ev'ry hour, in joy or pain; Come quickly and abide, Or life is vain

I need Thee ev'ry hour, Most Holy One; O make me Thine indeed, Thou blessed Son.

I checked this hymn out because it appeared to be the only one in the hymn book written by this hymnist. True enough, on searching it is the only hymn text still in common usage after over 400 poems and verse she wrote while living in New York and a member of Hanson Place Baptist Church.

She wrote: One day in 1872 as a young wife and mother I was busy with regular household tasks during a bright June morning. Suddenly I became filled with the sense of nearness to the Master, and I began to wonder how anyone could ever live without Him, either in joy or pain. Then, the words were ushered into my mind and these thoughts took full possession of me.

Sixteen years later on the death of her husband she wrote "I did not understand at first why this hymn had touched the great throbbing heart of humanity. It was not until long years later, when the shadow fell over my way, the shadow of a great loss, that I understood something of the

comforting power in the words, which I had been permitted to give to others in my hour of sweet serenity and peace." *Taken from 101 more Hymn Stories* ALISON JPS/AB 21
