HONING IN ON HYMNS

Jesus Loves Me

Anna B Warner 1820-1915

Undoubtedly this hymn has influenced children for Christ more than any other. Written in 1860 by Anna Bartlett Warner in collaboration with her sister Susan as a part of a best selling novel of the day, entitled Say and Seal, the plot of the novel is remembered by few, but the simple poem spoken by one of the characters remains a favourite hymn of children around the world to this day. The popularity of Jesus Loves Me spread quickly and numerous stories are told by missionaries of the appeal this hymn text had with children of every culture, and even heard in Buddhist Temples singing 'Yes, Buddha loves me'.

The sisters were born in New York, highly educated and deeply devoted Christian young women, who lived alongside the Hudson River close to a military academy. They taught Sunday school classes for young cadets.

After their father's death they were left with little income and turned to serious literary writing; of their most popular books was The Wild, Wide World, considered only second to Uncle Tom's Cabin in the best seller category.

Both sisters were given military honors on their death in recognition of their spiritual contributions to the lives of young military officers.

The tune was composed by Dr William Bradbury, a familiar name attached to many of our favourite hymns.

Thank you for writing about Jesus Loves Me Alison. I've been singing it since I was three years old. I even remember my Sunday School teacher at the Baptist Church in what is now called Cambridge. Mrs. Drinkwater called us her "little lambs" and when I saw her on the church's special anniversary celebration and I was probably in my early fifties she said "Well here's one of my little lambs!"

Even when I was tiny I knew it was true that Jesus loved me. I never once in my life have questioned that idea although there have been times when I've had a serious chat with Him asking about why things didn't work out the way that I thought they should have. But then that's why He is God and I am not. I believe that He is fine with our questions. He understands our humanity because that's the way He made us.

I especially like the line in the last verse that says "He will stay close beside me all the way."
